REFLECTION

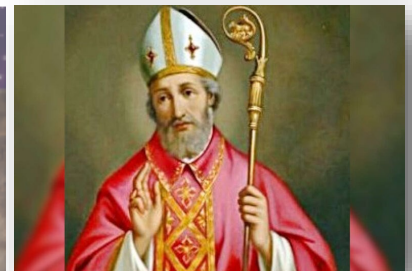
Scientists studying the Shroud of Turin (the cloth traditionally believed to be Jesus' burial cloth) have concluded that the image on the cloth was created by a flash of light radiation – more powerful than any UV radiation source known today. This gives some insight into the power of the Resurrection. What are the implications of such power for our faith? For our daily life?

When the disciple John sees the signs of Jesus' Resurrection, his response is belief. What is our response to Jesus, who gives us his everything...his miracles, his friendship, his forgiveness, and finally, his life...all so that we might live joyfully here on Earth and eternally in Heaven?

Have you heard of the Shroud of Turin before? What do you think of the scientists' conclusion on how the image was created?

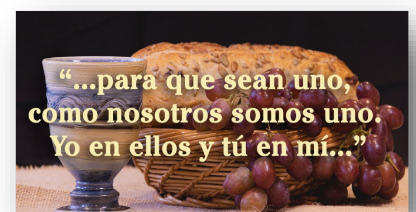
How can our family keep the joy of Easter alive and vibrant throughout the Easter Season?



SAN ANSELMO (1033-1109)
21 de abril

Anselmo nació en una familia cortesana, en Italia. De niño abrigó la idea del sacerdocio, pero la vida cortesana le hizo olvidarlo. No obstante, su madre le recordó que la felicidad estaba en el cielo. A la muerte de su padre buscó a un líder espiritual de su tiempo llamado Lafranco y posteriormente decide ser monje benedictino. Ahí desarrolló una amistad profunda con Lafranco sucediéndole, años después, como abad del monasterio. Como tal se distinguió por su virtud y conocimientos intelectuales, además de ser un gran maestro. Posteriormente, el rey Guillermo de Inglaterra lo nombró Arzobispo de Canterbury, pero se negó arguyendo que los nombramientos sólo los hace el Papa. Finalmente, por pedido del Papa aceptó, aunque en lo sucesivo enfrentó muchos conflictos con el Rey porque éste quería apoderarse de la Iglesia y nombrar obispos. Debido a su fidelidad al Papa sufrió el destierro y, posteriormente, con el sucesor Enrique I vivió las mismas dificultades. Hasta la fecha es conocido por la profundidad de sus escritos y por tal motivo fue declarado Doctor de la Iglesia en 1720.

LITURGY OF LIGHT

This prayer experience can be celebrated at home any time during the Easter Season. It is based on a portion of the liturgy celebrated at the Easter Vigil Mass, and can augment children's understanding and reflection upon what they see happening at church.

Prepare a darkened room with a cloth placed on a coffee or kitchen table. You will need one larger candle (held by a parent); give an unlit tea-light to each family member. Start in a different room. Holding the unlit larger candle, explain:

The Meaning of the Paschal Candle

At Church we have a very large candle that is called the Easter or Paschal Candle. **It is a sign of the Risen Jesus.** For our prayer today, we will use this smaller candle as our own Paschal Candle.

Even before Jesus was born, God's people were expecting "a great light" to come. Then, on the first Christmas, Jesus was born. **The great light came to our world!**

Light the larger candle.

Light is beautiful and makes us want to look at it, and get closer to it. That's how the people around Jesus felt. But then, we know that on **Good Friday, Jesus died on the cross. The light went out.**

Extinguish the candle.

But on Easter Sunday, what happened? Jesus rose from the dead! He came back to life!

Relight the candle.

And this time, the light of Jesus can never be put out again! His light is stronger than

Sing a simple, joyful "Alleluia" song like one we'd sing before the Gospel reading at Mass.

A Reading from the Gospel of Mark

When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary, the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go and anoint him. Very early when the sun had risen, on the first day of the week, they came to the tomb. They were saying to one another, "Who will roll back the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" When they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled back; it was very large. On entering the tomb they saw a young man sitting on the right side, clothed in a white robe, and they were utterly amazed. He said to them, "Do not be amazed! You seek Jesus of Nazareth, the crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Behold, the place where they laid him. But go and tell his disciples and Peter, 'He is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him, as he told you.'" Then they went out and fled from the tomb. . . (Mark 16:1-8a)

Explain that you will now have a little procession into the darkened room. Everyone follows the parent with the lit candle, and sings when appropriate



The Procession

Stopping at three different points on the way, sing at each stop (make up your own chant if you're not familiar with the tune!):

"Christ our light; thanks be to God!"

Place the candle on the prepared table. Then read or sing the following excerpts from a poetic proclamation sung at the Easter Vigil Mass, called the Exsultet.

Exult, let them exult, the hosts of heaven! Let the trumpet of salvation sound aloud our mighty King's triumph! Be glad, let earth be glad, as glory floods her, ablaze with light from her eternal King, let all the corners of the earth be glad, knowing an end to gloom and darkness. Rejoice!

This is the night, when Christ broke the prison-bars of death and rose victorious from the underworld. This is the night of which it is written: The night shall be as bright as day.

On this, your night of grace, O holy Father, accept this candle, a solemn offering, the work of bees and of your servants' hands, an evening sacrifice of praise.

The Sharing of the Light

The Risen Jesus didn't keep the light to himself. Of course, he came to share that light with everyone! When we were Baptized, he gave us this light in a special way. Our parents or godparents received a little Baptismal candle that was actually lit from the Paschal Candle. We're going to light our small candles now, to remind us of this.

Call each family member by name to come forward and have their tea-light lit from the larger candle. Take a moment of silence to note and enjoy the growing glow that has filled the dark room. Then quietly ask:

Our candles are just a symbol. Where do we hold the actual light of the Risen Jesus? And like Jesus, is this light meant just for us?

Take a moment for quiet family conversation about this theme or to lift up any spontaneous prayers that come to your hearts and minds or even sing a favorite praise song. Do what feels right for your family. Then, have everyone set their light around the larger candle for the closing prayer.

Closing Prayer (from the Exsultet)

May this flame be found still burning by the Morning Star: the one Morning Star who never sets, Christ your Son, who, coming back from death's domain, has shed his peaceful light on humanity, and lives and reigns forever and ever. Amen.

Close with an appropriate song, such as "Christ the Lord is Risen Today."

Background Information on the Paschal Candle

- **Paschal** refers to the suffering, death, & resurrection of Jesus.
- **Designs vary, but include:** a cross, the Greek letters "alpha" and "omega" (symbolizing that God is the beginning and the end—eternal), the year, and five pieces of incense pinned onto the cross (symbolizing the wounds of Jesus).
- A new candle is blessed each Easter and remains in the sanctuary for the entire Easter season (until Pentecost). It is used for Baptisms and funeral Masses throughout the year.



The entire season of Easter is for feasting, but during this time there are also several saints & celebrations in the Church to celebrate too!



April 25: Feast of St. Mark the Evangelist

- St. Mark the Evangelist wrote the 2nd Gospel and is credited with translating the Gospel in Greek to evangelize to Gentiles. Learn more about St. Mark at catholic.org
- Read a passage from the Gospel of Mark, some options include when Jesus heals the paralyzed man (Mark 2:1-12) or the parable of the seed that grows itself, which only appears in Mark's gospel (Mark 4:26-29)



April 28: Feast of St. Gianna Molla

- Grab your crayons and markers and color a coloring sheet from [the Little Rose Shop](#) of St. Giana Molla
- Say a pray for doctors and mothers who work outside of the home
- St. Gianna famously prayed "whatever God wants". Reflect on what God wants for you today.



April 29: Feast of St. Catherine of Siena

- Feed the hungry by volunteering at a food pantry, making a donation, or organizing a food drive!
- Grab your crayons and markers and color a coloring sheet from [the Little Rose Shop](#) of St. Catherine of Siena
- Pray the [Litany of St. Catherine of Siena](#)

May 1: Feast of St. Joseph the Worker

- Place an image of St. Joseph in a prominent place in your home
- Add a [St. Joseph prayer](#) to mealtime grace.
- May 1st is also International Worker's Day. St. Joseph is the patron of workers, offer up a special prayer for all workers through his intercession today.
- Going to the store today? Make an extra effort to say thank you to the store associates during your trip.



May 13: Feast of Our Lady of Fatima

- The Feast of Our Lady of Fatima is extra special for children, because Our Lady chose 3 special children to reveal herself to and share her secrets with. Kids can learn more about these apparitions from [ETWN's "Fatima Special"](#) on YouTube.
- The Little Rose Shop has many beautiful Marian coloring sheets for kids, including one of for the [Blessed Virgin Mary](#), a [Hail Mary](#), and a [Rosary](#) sheet.

- Practice praying the Angelus, which is traditionally prayed three times a day at 6 AM, noon, and 6 PM.
- Take a meal to family with a new baby, in tribute of Mary's visit to her own pregnant cousin Elizabeth



June 1: Feast of the Ascension

- More fully participate in Sunday Mass by reading the Scriptural account of the Ascension beforehand ([Acts 1:1-11](#)).
- To teach younger children about the Ascension and heaven, check out ["My Time with Jesus - Ep. 31 - The Ascension of Jesus"](#) by EWTN on YouTube.
- Weather permitting, lie on your back in the grass and look up at the sky. Reflect on what it was like for Jesus' friends to watch him go up into heaven.
- This feast reminds us of our belief in the resurrection of our own bodies at the end of time. Do something intentional to care for your body like taking a walk or eating a healthy snack.
- In Jesus' absence, his friends hid in fear. Plan to give someone the comfort of your presence this week.

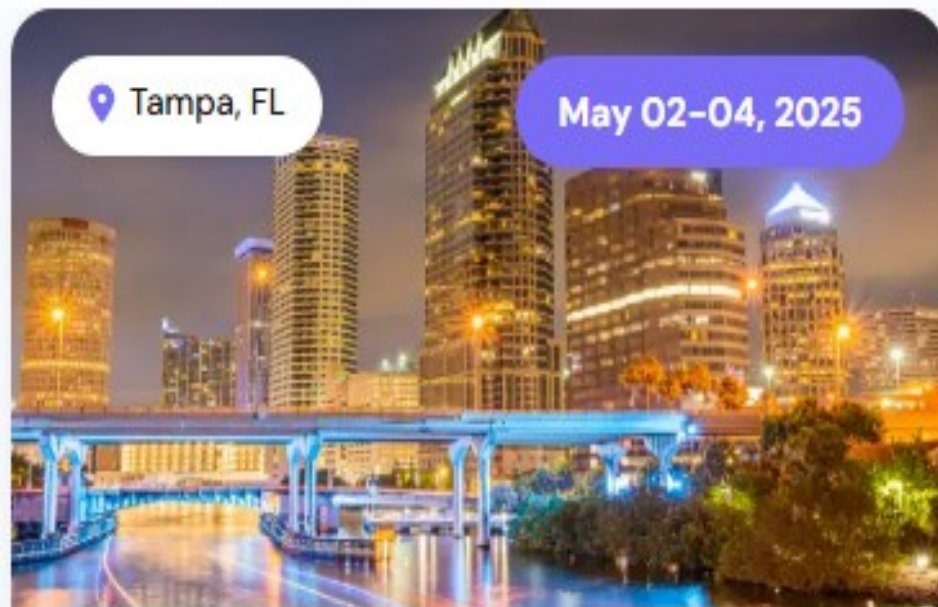

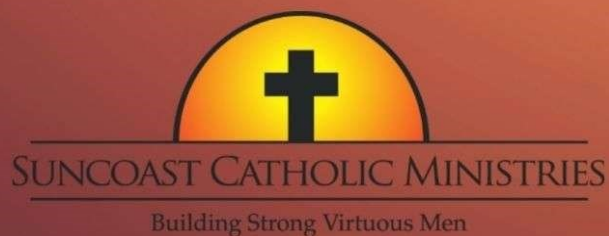
